 - The EOC was situated in Hamilton and the Incident Control Point (ETS exercise) was in Gisborne.

Rhythm and Vines (R & V)

- R & V is a music venue held during the New Year period in Gisborne.
- Up to 30 000 people attend
- ► Held over 3 days this year (previously 1 day)
- St John Midland Region decided to use this event to test the Midland Regional Mass Casualty (MC) Plan and use the findings to support the R & V Operational Plan.

Key Performance Indicators

- Notification
- Activation of Midland Regional Mass Casualty (MC) plan
- Chain of command
- Allocation of resources
- Patient tracking

Participants

Scenario

- > 2300 hrs New Years Eve
- Party goers were in full swing until a riot occurred. Then suddenly a wall collapsed and party goers were trapped.
- Police and St John in the crowd activated their notification systems.
- Event Managers, Police, Fire, Security, St John then assembled in area that became the EOC.
- Police became the lead agency



Scenario

- ▶ 49 injured patients (gubers)
- Status 1-8
- ► Status 2 10
- ► Status 3 20
- ► Remainder walking wounded...

Boards

- Scene
- Casualty clearing post
- ▶ Transport
- Walking wounded tent
- Emergency Department

Outcomes

- Notification: Internal cascade was tested during this exercise
- Tested the St John Midland Regions MC Plan in response to the surge of mass casualties involved in the exercise incident
- Good timely intervention of patient management options (adverse outcomes were measured by the medical umpire)
- Effective patient tracking occurred

Recommendations

- Review roles and responsibility task lists that are distributed to staff once the Health Plan is activated.
- Ensure that the event staff members and resources are reflected and included in the activation process of the Health Emergency Plan.
- Involve the wider emergency service group and District Health Board in the next exercise.
- Consider adopting the patient tracking form at the CCP
- The R & V Steering group will use these findings when developing the R & V operational plan.
- The St John Midland Regional Management group will also hold a post exercise cold debrief
